From the chaplain

In Luke 19:1-10, we are told of how Jesus invites himself to stay with Zaccheus, the man others dislike because he is a tax collector; the short man presumably dressed in riches and incongruously perched in a tree for a better view of Jesus. I continue to be struck by the following in this passage:

Firstly, how would I react to Zaccheus, the man who likely added his own markup to the tax he collected - would I want to shun him? Would I want to shout at him out of judgement? Would I be embarrassed by his peculiar behavior, dressed impeccably and positioned up a tree? Would I ignore him, worried about what others would think of me? In contrast, how did Jesus respond?

Secondly, Jesus says he will "abide" with Zaccheus that day - not just visit for an hour before attending to other matters. To "abide" as it is used in this context is akin to the term, "being present in the moment", deeply, with another - for as long as that moment needs to last. How wonderful to "abide" with God in our quiet times!
