

### MEET THE LATIN DEPARTMENT

Latin is the great ancestor of French, Italian, Spanish and Portuguese. In South Africa, Latin inscriptions can often be seen in the mottos of schools and various other institutions, such as our own motto, *Candida Rectaque* "Honest and Upright". Latin terminology is also found in a wide range of professional fields, including Law, the Sciences, and Humanities, as well as in the names of many international companies and products, such as Volvo, Nivea, Pro Vita and Bonaqua. # **ACCOUNTING**

One of the topics that forms part of the Form IV Accounting syllabus is the manufacturing business. As an introduction to learning about this, the Form IV Accounting students were provided with a number of different raw materials to build a boat.

The following raw materials were provided as well as an indication of the costs involved:

20 colour wooden planks
 2 polystyrene blocks
 2 mast skewers
 1/4 sheet of coloured sail foam
 R1 each
 R8 a full sheet

Use of glue
Use of glitter glue
Use of own paint/crayon/koki
Rent of your desk (factory)
R6

Electricity
 Cost of the factory supervisor (teacher)
 R2 for the lesson
 R7 per student

• Cost of your labour R10

The following simple instructions were provided in order to build the boat:

- 1. Assemble (glue) your wooden planks to make your boat.
- $2. \ Insert the \ mast \ skewers \ into \ the \ polystyrene \ blocks \ (sharp \ end \ into \ the \ polystyrene) \ then \ glue \ the \ polystyrene \ blocks \ onto \ your \ boat's \ deck.$
- 3. Cut out your foam sail(s) and glue to your mast skewer.

The girls then went to work and used their creativity to complete the task of assembling a well-designed sailing boat. A week later, after allowing the glue to dry on the boats, the class attempted to set sail. We were pleasantly surprised at the number of boats that were able to float. This was a fun exercise to see how raw materials are converted into a finished product. Well done, Form IV accounting students.

Below, please find details as to how to access the Ed-Admin St Mary's parent portal:

- You will require a Parent ID whenever signing into the parent portal. If you are unsure of your Parent ID, please email portal@stmary.co.za with both you and your daughter's names and surnames for assistance.

- Enter in your Parent ID and choose 'forgot password'. Please ensure that you enter the email address that St Mary's has on record and enter in the CAPTCHA code.
- You will then receive an email. Once received, click on the link in order to set up your password. Choose a secure password. You will then receive another email to confirm your password has been changed. You can now proceed to log into the portal.
