# FROM THE HEAD'S DESK

A birthday celebration is thrilling and, when you are celebrating 134 years, it deserves an occasion. Yesterday was such a celebration of St Mary's School. Our Patronal Festival is an annual celebration of our patron saint, Mary, the mother of our Lord Jesus Christ. As the beautiful mosaic above the angel doors denotes, we have in Saint Mary a patron saint who, while a young girl, showed great faith and courage in order to say "yes" to God.

The Patronal Festival marks another year in the existence of our school. Our festival traditionally takes place in May, as close to the Festival of the Blessed Virgin Mary as possible in our calendar. This year we chose to celebrate on Ascension Day, a high and holy day in the Christian calendar.

St Mary's School celebrated its birthday for the first time when it turned three in 1891. In 2022, our faith remains the lodestar of the school.

The service is traditionally held in The Close and it was led by Revd Rakgadi, with our guest, Revd Cynthia Botha delivering the sermon. Pupils from across the school were included in reading and leading the congregation in prayer. The service was enhanced with music and singing which lifted us all spiritually, and its mosaic rooted us in the Anglican faith and our South African context.

The celebration then moved to the Howell Hub where the entire school enjoyed a picnic. The exuberance and the ability of St Mary's girls to have fun, commune with one another, and revel in celebration has always made the Patronal Festival a memorable occasion. These festivities reminded us of how much we had missed during the pandemic and how important it is to gather in community.

# FROM THE CHAPLAIN

After two years of being online, yesterday Patronal fever was in the air. We returned to the familiar.

Our preacher and celebrant at this year's Patronal Festival was Revd Canon Cynthia Botha, convener of the liturgical committee currently revising the prayer book. In her reflection on *The nature and purpose of worship: a local South African perspective* (2004), she describes herself: "I belong to the so called-coloured population group in South Africa, which during the apartheid era in our country formed part of the oppressed people and was discriminated against...we are a people caught between a strongly western tradition on the one side and an African tradition on the other side...this being between two worlds is reflected in our life and worship." She closes her reflection by saying, "...part of the wonder of Anglican liturgy - it is adaptable yet very recognisable as being "Anglican", and one soon feels at home in new surroundings."

The theme of Revd Cynthia's sermon was *Endings and Beginnings*. The celebration of our Patronal Festival on Ascension Day is the coming together of beginnings and endings- a collision of joys. The beginning is marked by Mary's 'yes' to carrying in her womb God Incarnate whose birth, life, death and resurrection would irrevocably change all of creation. The ending marked by the ascension of Jesus offers us a chance at a new beginning that can give us a new lease on life and contribute to our renewal. She also reminded us that God loves us and wants us to be happy.

As we celebrated our Patronal, we followed in the footsteps of those who came before us as we sang.

Tell out, my soul, the glories of his word!

Firm is his promise, and his mercy sure:

tell out, my soul, the greatness of the Lord to children's children and for evermore!

#### **DIVING**




### **OLD GIRLS NEWS**

#### **ED-ADMIN**

Below, please find details as to how to access the Ed-Admin St Mary's portal:

- You will require a Parent ID whenever signing into the parent portal. If you are unsure of your Parent ID, please email portal@stmary. co.za with both your and your daughter's names and surnames for assistance.
- To access the St Mary's portal, please click on the link below or visit the school website on <a href="www.stmarysschool.co.za">www.stmarysschool.co.za</a> and click on the portal login on the top right of the page.

- Enter in your Parent ID and choose 'forgot password'. Please ensure that you enter the email address that St Mary's has on record and enter in the CAPTCHA code.
- You will then receive an email. Once received, click on the link in order to set up your password. Choose a secure password. You will then receive another email to confirm your password has been changed. You can now proceed to log into the portal.
